Why do we try?

These are all questions that are raised. In days gone by it would have been 'because I say so!'. Now we want to create independent, resilient learners. Setting learning in a real context with practical application allows children to make links, to challenge each other in a safe and supportive Christian community.

When asking your child what did you do today? Take a moment to ask them. How will you use what you have learnt today? The more they think the greater the links become and the stronger their resilience to future problems.

Holidays in term time

I am aware holidays during the school breaks are expensive; as school staff we have the exact same problem. Approval of holidays will not be granted, it is not a personal issue, it is school policy. If your child misses 10 sessions (5 days) a fine is issued per child per parent. As a school we do not receive any of the money and it does involve additional administration time. If you do take your child out of school they miss key learning and we do not set holiday work or catch up activities.

Crossing

We are linking with the emergency services to engage HCC Transport Department in reviewing our crossing. In the meantime please park respectfully and keep drivers lines of sight clear. Outside drop off and collection times, the road is clear and drivers have clarity of uninterrupted vision around the crossing, this means that the road is not necessarily classed as high risk. We are also linking with the School Travel and Walk once a Week (WoW) Schemes to see where we can help to keep our children safe. More news to follow.

Water bottles in school

Please send your child into school with a refillable water bottle. We have an increasing number of children who are forgetting their bottles. We have three water machines round the school, please help us to ensure your child is hydrated. Research has shown that children who keep hydrated are more able to sustain learning and reduces head-aches, so we try and encourage the children to drink water as often as possible.

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Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural

Thank you once again to the PTA for arranging the Toy and Book sale, and the cake sale. The PTA are engaged with the school and planning towards a sensory garden for the children. It will be a wonderful addition to school resources and a very exciting prospect.
