Personal Development, Behaviour and Welfare

Over the past months the school has been working with the children, parents, the PTA, and the local community to make our roads safer. We had great news last week when we were awarded the Bronze STARs award for work done so far, but I was disappointed to get this email today from a local resident:

"Last year I emailed you regarding some dangerous parking practices outside of your school during the morning drop off. I'm afraid it seems that the situation is getting bad again; today, as my partner walked to the station along Partridge Road, there was a camper van parked on the corner with Sway Road, and a truck reversed around this and onto the pavement, nearly hitting her. There were also several other vehicles, also dropping off children, parked over the pavement too. This type of behaviour now seems like a daily occurrence; please could you remind parents again that driving on pavements is illegal, as is parking causing an obstruction to other road users (including pedestrians)?

Partridge Road is not particularly narrow, so there is especially no need to park on the pavement here. The dangers presented to pedestrians, including other children travelling to school, are real - there have been several high-profile cases recently where small children have been killed by drivers illegally mounting the pavement. This seems at odds with the idea that we should be encouraging children to walk more for health, attentional and environmental reasons; the behaviour of a few selfish parents makes the local environment feel more dangerous and therefore less conducive for active travel (even it is walking from just a little further up the road) by walking, cycling or using a scooter."

We have received a few responses from parents who would like to use the Village Hall car parking facility 'Park & Stride'; Mrs Wallis will be issuing the stickers in due course. The launch day for this is on Thursday 26th April. All people who would like to use the Park & Stride will meet at the village hall and we will walk the children to school together. There will be a special visitor, Basil Bird', to welcome the children at the school gate. Please get involved and help to make the roads around the school safer. 
RDA Collection Box The RDA are trying to raise money for a Training Centre Project.
