

The mysterious bones (pages 10–11)

- 1 2c – 1 mark. Danny has found a part of a skeleton in the leat and thinks it's the skeleton of a murdered man, so he and Tyke run down to look at it.
- 2 2f – 1 mark for any of the following: One of the lines is from a song. The other two are a joke. They are different to the story./Danny is singing a song and tells Tyke a joke before the story begins./To separate the song and joke from the story.
- 3 2b – 1 mark for each detail.
 - 1 Tyke tells Danny that the bones weren't there last week.
 - 2 He tells him that they are a sheep's bones like the one Martin Kneeshaw found and he repeats it.
- 4 2a – 1 mark for all correctly written: skeleton/who's been murdered/brought
- 5 2d – 1 mark – Tyke. The story is written in the first person using the words *I, me, we*, etc. We know the narrator is called Tyke because Danny says '*It's lovely, Tyke*' and '*It's a real skellinton, Tyke*' when talking to the narrator.
- 6 2e/2h – 2 marks. Tyke might take it out of the water just to prove it is a sheep as Danny doesn't believe him. Danny might call the police because he really believes it is the remains of a dead body and he didn't believe it was a sheep skeleton.
