

Treasure Island (pages 18–19)

1 2c – 1 mark. Answers related to the transportation and seizure of the gold from the island to the ship, e.g. The movement of the gold./The gold is moved / transported to the ship./Booty from shore to ship.

2 a) 2g – 1 mark – To autumn leaves

b) 2g – 2 marks for developed answer (with or without the identification of a simile): It is a simile which compares the way in which the coins are scattered on the floor like autumn leaves scattered on the ground because he had to bend down to pick them up./To describe the way in which the coins are scattered on the floor like autumn leaves that have fallen to the ground. His back ached from picking them up.

1 mark for undeveloped answer: The coins are lying on the floor like leaves.

3 2b – 1 mark for all correctly ordered:

Treasure was put in piles. 4

The coins were sorted out. 2

Two men sailed the boat to the ship and back. 5

The coins were put into bread-bags. 3

A soldier kept watch on the hill. 1

4 2f – 1 mark. The coins have come from all over the world.

5 2d – Award 3 marks for fully developed answer referring to the text: No, it wasn't easy. It says it was a considerable task for a few people which means it was difficult as the gold was heavy. Only two bars of gold at a time could be carried in a rope by one man walking slowly. Even sorting out the coins made one man's back and fingers ache.

Award 2 marks for fully developed answer: No. The gold was heavy. One man could only carry two bars of gold and they had to take it a long way to get to the ship.

Award 1 mark for an undeveloped answer: No. The gold was heavy and it took a long time to move it slowly to the beach.
