

### Footwear fashions (pages 26–27)

- 1 2a – 1 mark – rich; wealthy; well-off; not having to work
- 2 2b – 1 mark for all lines drawn correctly:
  - ankle boots – 1830s
  - wellington boots – 1820s
  - moccasins – 17th century
  - brogues – 16th century
  - wooden clogs – Middle Ages
- 3 2f – 1 mark. For the technical/real names of the footwear; to show that these words are unusual/unfamiliar either because they are foreign (e.g. *maxkeseni* and *chopine*) or are old-fashioned (e.g. *pattens*).
- 4 2h – 1 mark for reference to either of these points:
  - Clogs were made of wood/other shoes were made of animal skins, leather, included embellishments such as satin and buttons.
- 5 2b – 1 mark. Buttons and buckles replaced laces.
- 6 2c – Award 1 mark for all four correct:
  - false/true/false/true
