



# 'The Storm Whale'









Every day, Noi's dad left early for a long day's work on his fishing boat.



He wouldn't be home again till dark.








- What has happened?

· How would you help?




Today we will be practising saying our sentences out loud in a nice clear voice.

Next, write it down into your book.


Then say your sentence out loud again - does it still have all of the words?


Now, use the success criteria to check your sentences.

Capital letters at the beginning of a sentence
Capital letters for 'I'
Full stops at the end of a sentence
Finger spaces between words
Exclamation marks if we are exclaiming
Question marks if we are asking a question
Using 'because' to give our opinion
Strong reasons to convince dad








Noi did everything he could to make the whale feel at home.
