



'The Storm Whale'








Every day, Noi's dad left early for a long day's work on his fishing boat.





He wouldn't be home again till dark.


One night, a great storm had raged around their house.


In the morning, Noi went down to the beach to see what had been left behind.












Noi did everything he could to make the whale feel at home.

Let's look at four types of sentences.

## Statement

A sentence that states facts or what is happening: The table is big.

## Question

A sentence which asks somebody something: What is your name?

## Exclamation

A sentence where something is shouted out loud, possibly in surprise or horror: Oh no!

# Command

A sentence which tells someone what to do: Come here!

Types of Sentences

### <u>Statements</u>

Statements are sentences which tell you something, like a fact. They should contain a verb, a noun and usually end with a full stop.

Lots of children want to see a whale.

The statement might tell the reader how brilliant something is.

Whales are the best animals in the ocean.

Types of Sentences



Questions are sentences that ask you something. They usually end with a question mark.

## What is your favourite type of whale?

You might ask a question that sounds like we should give one obvious answer, usually yes or no.

Would you like to swim with a whale?

Types of Sentences

### <u>Commands</u>

Commands are sentences that tell you to do something. They are found in instructions and start with an imperative verb (bossy word).

Carry the whale.

The command might be telling us to do something.

Help a whale today.

Types of Sentences

## Exclamations

An exclamation is a sentence beginning with 'What' or 'How'. It is a full sentence, including a verb, which ends with an exclamation mark.

What a terrific fin he has!

The exclamation sentence might be used to make it seem like the writer truly thinks something is amazing.

What a delightful boat this is! How fun it is to go to the beach and save a whale! Let's look at some of the sentences you came up with earlier for what dad might say.

Are they statements, exclamations, questions or commands?


