Page 10: Why did Stone Age people go hunting?

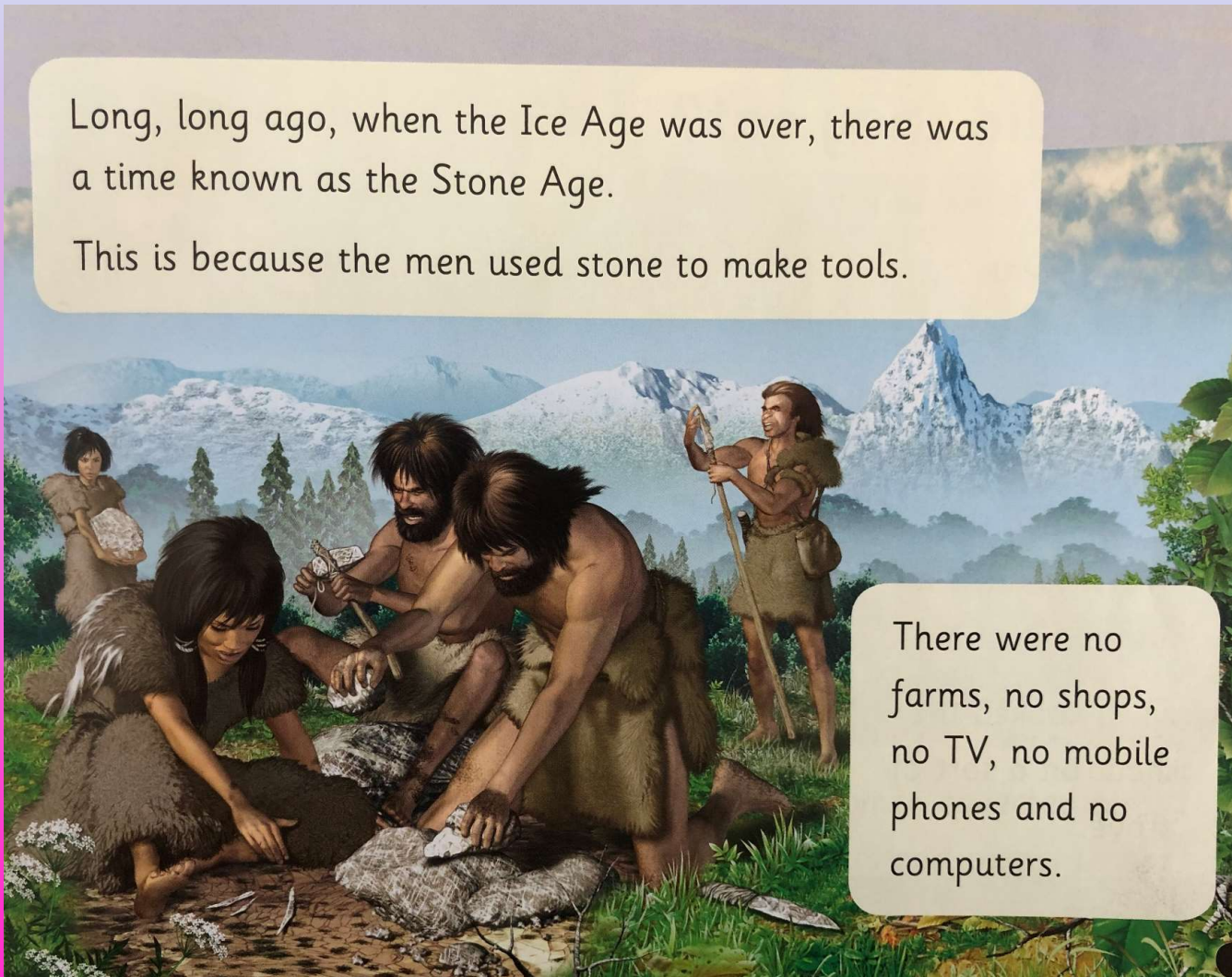

There were no farms, no shops, no TV, no mobile phones and no computers.

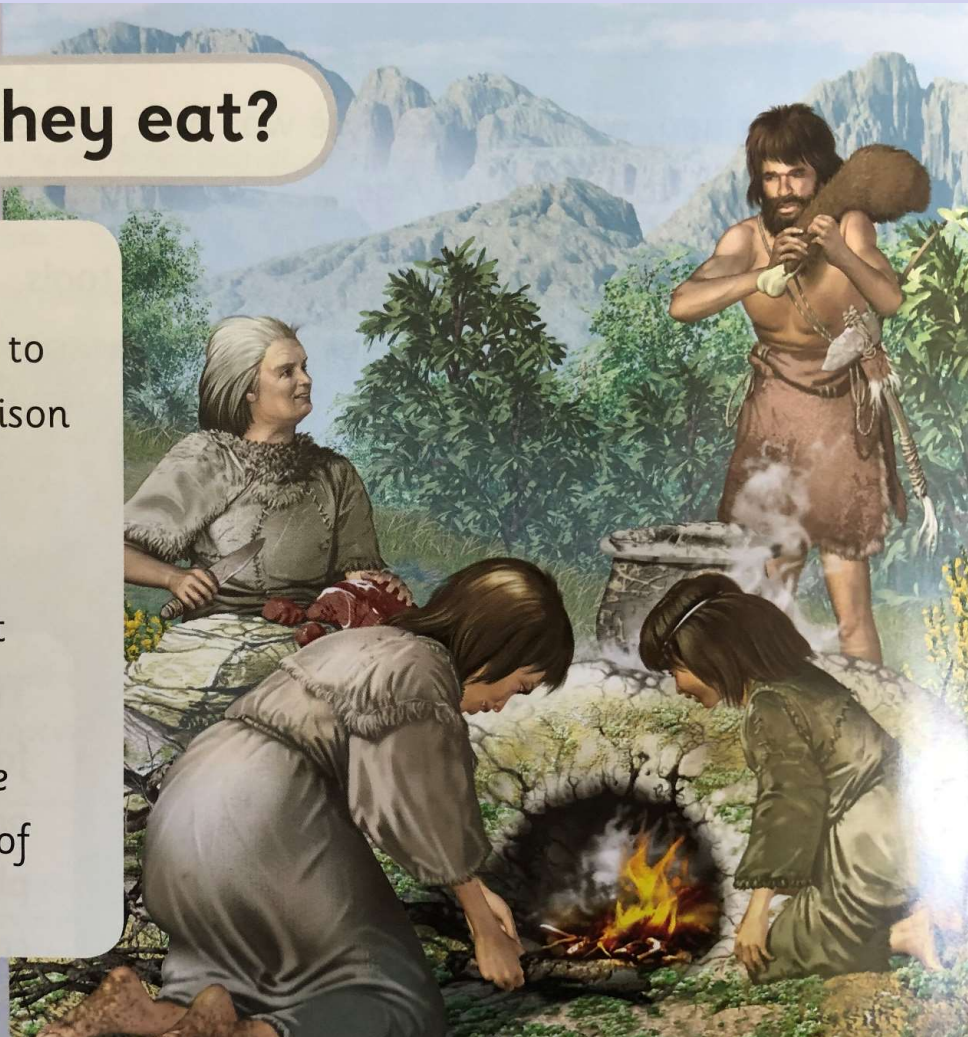


## What did they eat?

People went hunting, hoping to see a horse, a bison or an antelope.

They killed the beast, skinned it and cut it up.

They cooked the meat on a sort of stove.



They caught fish and smoked it to stop it going bad.



Men and women collected birds' eggs and nuts and plants to eat.



## What were the homes like?

Because people followed the animals to get meat, they didn't stay in the same place for long.

They made huts or tents, using poles made from branches and animal skins.

They slept in caves, too.

## What were the clothes like?

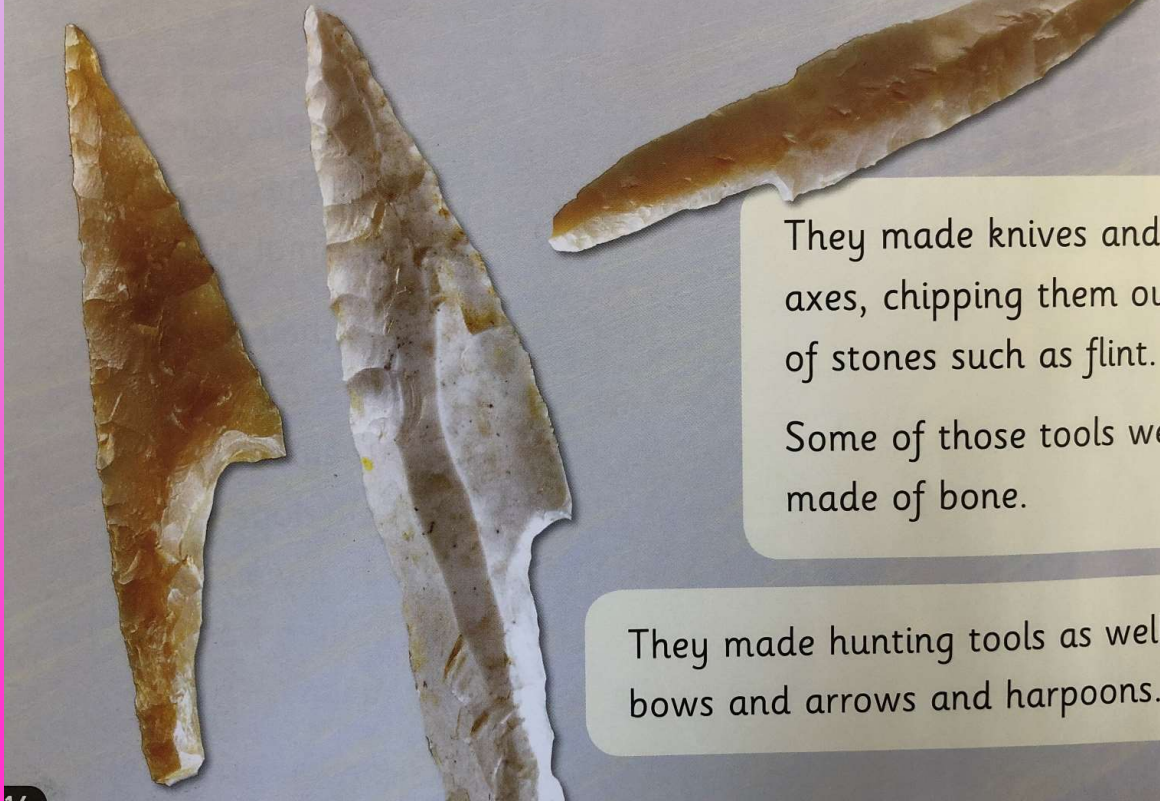


People wore clothes made of animal skins.

If they were going hunting, they wore antelope horns as a way of hiding from the animals.



## How did they make tools?



They made knives and axes, chipping them out of stones such as flint.

Some of those tools were made of bone.

They made hunting tools as well – bows and arrows and harpoons.

## Were there Stone Age artists?

Drawings of animals were made on the walls of caves.

They drew with yellow, white and red rock.
