Amazing Hotels – Descriptions

Giraffe Manor, Kenya

This gorgeous old manor house has a long history and an uplifting atmosphere. The excitement of wonderful giraffes pushing their noses through the windows of the breakfast room is shared by guests and staff alike. The giraffes are nurtured within the 140 acres of the estate, until they are ready to be reintroduced into the wilds of safer National Parks and game reserves. There is a chance to take the longest zip-wire in South America, 450 metres above ground. The rooms are log cabins and the windows look out onto the surrounding mountains.

Have you ever wanted to sleep in a condor's nest? Here is the next best thing! A transparent luxury capsule that hangs from the top of a mountain in the Sacred Valley of Peru.
