Where our pupils travel from	Our school is centred in the village of Brockenhurst in the New Forest. Brockenhurst is a fairly large village in the forest, and the school is filled with mainly catchment children. There is a railway station, sixth form college, several large hotels and a number of shops spreading along the high street. There are also two churches. This means there is an excess amount of traffic on the roads around the school. Many of the minor roads where the children live do not have footpaths. The staff are unable to afford houses in Brockenhurst as it is a very affluent area, the longest journey for one member of staff is 40 minutes by road.
