## Welcome:

Dear Parents and Friends of Brockenhurst CE Primary and Pre-School

You will have seen the news regarding the rise in cases of measles in London and the large outbreaks in the West Midlands. The UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) has now declared a national incident in order to focus actions to limit the spread. Further outbreaks of measles will spread to other towns and cities unless urgent action is taken to increase Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR) vaccination uptake in areas at greatest risk. Children who get measles can be very poorly and some will suffer life changing complications. To support this incident the Department of Education (DfE) has published: What to do if you think your child has measles and when to keep them off school guidance for parents and for schools. UKHSA have stated that measles is not currently circulating in the south-east, there are cases in London and a sustained outbreak in the West Midlands (specifically Coventry and Birmingham but now in all local authority areas in the region) but at the moment in the SE, rashes are more than likely to be for other reasons (particularly in children). However being prepared is important.

- Holiday Club bookings can now be made for February half-term via your Scopay account. The holiday club price of £30 per day includes a morning and afternoon snack; children will need to bring their own packed lunch. We offer a £10 per day discount for all siblings who are also attending Holiday Club on the same day. Payment can be made with childcare vouchers if preferred; please contact the office for further details. The day runs from 8am until 5pm. Please note holiday club sessions are non-refundable.
- **Uniform** reminder: we ask that children do not wear nail varnish, smart watches or jewellery to school; this is with the exception of small, plain stud earrings. Long hair should be tied back with a plain hairband. Thank you.
- Please be considerate of our neighbours if parking in local roads at drop off and pick up times. We have a "Park & Stride" scheme which is an arrangement with the Village Hall in Highwood Road parents are welcome to park in the Village Hall car park at school drop off and pick up times to help ease congestion in the surrounding roads.
- Threadworms are common in children and spread easily. You can treat them without seeing a GP. Medicine is available from pharmacies; it is important that the whole family is treated. To prevent reinfection it is important to encourage children to wash hands regularly and scrub under fingernails particularly before eating and after using the toilet.
